

Green Market at Pioneer Park

GREEN MARKET AGREEMENT (2009-2010 SEASON)

The Green Market at Pioneer Park is located at Pioneer Park at the corner of Douglas Avenue and Main Street. The market is open every Friday morning beginning October 23, 2009 through May 28, 2010. If market is extended through the summer this agreement is still in effect even though market hours and day may be changed. Hours are 8:00 M to 1:00 PM. Vendors should plan to arrive at the market site before 7:30 AM and complete set-up by 8:00A.M. Vendors arriving consistently late may be refused vendor space for that week. All vendors are expected to remain in their designated area until 1:00 PM even if they are sold out of product. The Market Manager assigns spaces; no vendor has a permanent assigned location.

MARKET FEES SCHEDULE: (subject to change)

4 continuous weeks paid in advance	\$70.10 plus 7% sales tax=\$75.00
Casual Vendor	\$23.36 plus 7% sales tax=\$25.00

Vendor continuous late arrival maybe turned away without refund

VENDOR RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Vendors are required to bring their own tables, tablecloths, **white tent** (and weights for wind) and set up.
- All merchandise must be of good quality, no damaged, spoiled, outdated or used merchandise.
- Vendors should be courteous to all customers. You must be prepared to have bags and change available.
- No loud sound devises or hawking is permitted.
- Any vendor concerns should be reported to the Market Manager.
- The Market Manager shall have the authority to remove any vendor or product from the market and shall handle all vendor disputes.
- Vendors are responsible for protecting their merchandise in the event of inclement weather.
- Electricity is available on a limited basis with low amperage requirement available only.
There may be a small fee assessed.
- Vendor shall be responsible for any damage beyond normal wear and tear to the event space.
- Smoking in market area is prohibited around food or in their booth.
- No vendor shall possess alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs.
- Solicitation of any type (flyers, petitions, and requests for money) is not allowed within market boundaries.
Please inform the market manager if you see solicitation occurring.

PERMITTED PRODUCT LINES:

The City of Dunedin and Market Manager must approve vendors and vendor product lines. Vendors are not permitted to add any additional product lines without prior approval.

CITY OF DUNEDIN POLICIES

- Vendor can be cancelled at any time without liability.
- Vendor can occupy Green Market space only during prescribed market hours.
- Vendor shall be responsible for necessary permits and licenses.
- Vendor responsible for trash pick-up and removal around vendor space.
- No vehicles or heavy equipment permitted on Green Market park grounds.
- No broadcasting of music or other loud noise within the Green Market.
- Vendor shall not be considered agent or employee of the City of Dunedin.
- Alcoholic beverages are not allowed for sale or personal consumption.
- Vendors shall hold harmless and indemnify the City of Dunedin, Market Manager, city officials or its employees from any costs, judgement fees or charges arising from the vendor use of the Green Market.
- City reserves the right to disapprove any item it deems inappropriate to be sold on city owned property.
- Vendor acknowledges that the City reserves the right to retain at all times the Green Market area for the purpose of other public use and the city shall not give rise to any claims or damages or lost profits.

REGULATIONS AND POLICIES:

The vendor is responsible to secure all necessary licenses including but not limited to food for consumption, fish handler, etc. Contact the Florida Department of Agriculture, Food Safety Division. The City of Dunedin provides a blanket occupational license for all vendors during the operation of the Farmers Market. All licenses must be displayed and in compliance with the state licensing requirements. Vendor is responsible for collection and remittance of Florida State Sales Tax to the State of Florida. Two spaces per vendor (exception for produce and plant vendors) are the maximum allotment of space available.
