

PUBLIC NOTICE

U. S. Army Corps of Engineers, Jacksonville District Honeymoon Island Beach Renourishment, Phase II Permit Application No. SAJ-2011-02369 (IP-TEH)

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) has received an application for a Department of the Army permit pursuant to Section 404 of the Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C. §1344) and Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 (33 U.S.C. §403) from the Florida Department of Environmental Protection and the Pinellas County Board of County Commissioners to perform beach renourishment activities on Honeymoon Island in the City of Dunedin, Pinellas County, Florida. The beach renourishment activities are proposed within Honeymoon Island State Park in the vicinity of the two most northern parking lots on the Gulf of Mexico.

The applicants propose to install three groins supplemented by approximately 100,000 cubic yards of sand hydraulically dredged from nearby Hurricane Pass to provide erosion control for approximately 2,500 linear feet of shoreline. The proposed groins will be constructed of sheet pile and rock.
