

CAUSEWAY UTILITIES REPLACEMENT PROJECT SUMMARY



The City of Dunedin will soon replace nearly three miles of pipe that, since 1964, have provided potable water supply and sanitary wastewater transport along the Dunedin Causeway. Those sections of water main and force main will be replaced by new plastic pipe materials, which are not as susceptible to corrosion.

The project is located in Dunedin, Florida, from near the entrance of Honeymoon Island State Park, east to Alternate 19 (Bayshore Blvd) and to the south side of Curlew Road, on the east side of Alternate 19 (Bayshore Blvd).

Project construction will extend along much of the Causeway as illustrated in the attached image. The use of open cut methods of construction will be limited to a distance of about 1,200 feet in front of Royal Stewart Arms, and to a distance of about 800 feet at the east side of the Bascule bridge. The expected locations of excavations required for horizontal directional drilling methods of construction, to reduce interference with other activities along the Causeway, are indicated in the attached image. Although traffic may be slowed by construction vehicles, there is no reason to expect extended or severe traffic impacts.

Project construction is estimated to cost \$2,130,000. Project construction is expected to get underway in April, 2011 and require about eight months for completion.
