

**City of Dunedin
Environmental Advocate Award Program
General Information**

Purpose:

The purpose of the environmental advocate program is to identify and recognize members of our community whose actions protect and conserve the natural environment and contribute to the sustainability of the City of Dunedin. The City wishes to recognize the importance of these actions in an effort to increase public awareness of the environmental issues that affect the City and showcase the positive contributions that members of the community have made to improve the health of our local environment.

Eligible Applicants:

Individual residents, groups of residents, businesses, homeowner associations, neighborhood associations, or volunteer groups can be nominated for the environmental advocate award. You may nominate yourself or someone else.

Ineligible Applicants:

Current members of the Committee on Environmental Quality are not eligible to receive the environmental advocated award. Environmental activities must be outside of a nominee's normal paid work duties.

Ineligible Applications:

Incomplete applications are considered ineligible and will not be reviewed.

Environmental Advocate Selection:

Nomination forms are reviewed by a subcommittee of the Committee on Environmental Quality composed of residents of the City of Dunedin. The subcommittee chooses the award winner based on the completed application. The winner is notified and recognized by City of Dunedin staff.
