EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

INTRODUCTION

The City of Dunedin has become increasingly aware of the need to promote sustainable community partnerships that will enhance the education of students in Dunedin. Collaboration of City Officials with the Principals of eleven schools in Dunedin through quarterly meetings further underscored the importance of community and local government support for schools.

Various initiatives currently provide educational opportunities to students outside the classroom; however, many teachers, parents and students are unaware of these resources. Adopt-A-Classroom encourages local businesses and the community to partner with Dunedin Schools by providing financial and moral support to students and teachers. Adopt-A-Classroom is a 501(c) (3) tax-exempt nonprofit organization contributing one-hundred percent (100%) of all donations to the schools. Donors may register with Adopt-A-Classroom to contribute any amount with a minimum of twenty-five dollars (\$25) per classroom and all contributions are tax deductible. Adopt-A-Classroom does not send cash to the teacher. Donations are deposited into an online e-wallet account from which teachers may use the funds with a network of online vendors affiliated with Adopt-A-Classroom. Teachers may purchase resources such as learning games, books and other materials that help them create an engaging and effective classroom learning environment. Teachers may not use the funds for field trips.

Students may visit the Nature Center to participate in camps and the following programs: Adventures in Nature; Birds, Butterflies & Bees; Hammock Desert Trek; Spiders and Bats; and the Wild Orange Festival. Dunedin offers students opportunities to enjoy the environment at fifteen (15) parks throughout the City including: Amberlea Park; Curlew Creek Park; Dunedin Youth Guild Park; Eagle Scout Park; Edgewater Linear Park; Elizabeth Skinner-Jackson Park; Hammock Park; Happy Tails Dog Park; Highlander Park; John R. Lawrence Pioneer Park; Rotary Environmental Park; Scottsdale Park; Weaver Park, Trailside Oasis Park and the Pinellas County Trail. DUNEDIN FINE ART CENTER

The Dunedin Fine Art Center (DFAC) provides a broad range of programs to children from four and one-half (4.5) years of age, to teens fourteen (14) years of age. Five Summer Camp Programs are offered including: Mini-Masters; Sizzlin' Summer; Musical Theater; Mural Madness and Art Squad. DFAC features an interactive Children's Museum, youth classes and workshops that allow students to explore their artistic and cognitive abilities.

DFAC offers four different birthday party themes for a member and non-member fee including: Clay Jamboree; Arty-Party; Mr. Ray's Musical Theater Celebration; and Hands-On Celebration. DFAC, Dunedin Schools and the City of Dunedin will partner to present the Dunedin School Visual Arts Showcase. The annual exhibit will feature the artwork of students from Dunedin Schools and an opening reception. DFAC promotes membership in Parent Teacher Associations (PTA) by providing a ten dollar (\$10) discount to Parents and/or families demonstrating proof of membership in any Dunedin School PTA. The discount will save parents ten dollars (\$10) on children's classes and twenty dollars (\$20) on summer art camp programs.

DUNEDIN HISTORICAL MUSEUM

An essential part of the mission of the Dunedin Historical Museum is to foster educational opportunities in schools and non-traditional settings for students of all ages. Dunedin offers a unique way for students to interact with local, national, and international history and social issues. We rotate exhibits throughout the year, and develop related programming and events for all exhibits. Some programs are offered each year, while others might only be available for the duration of an exhibit. We are happy to work with schools and educators on specific themes if none of the programs offered match the needs of the class.

Education Programs:

Traveling Trunks:

This two-week loan program brings the Museum into your classroom. Traveling trunks are based on local history and exhibit themes, and consist of curriculum which matches State standards, artifacts (reproduction and occasionally original), and related books, CDs and DVDs. Permanent trunks are *Dunedin History*, *Dunedin and Stirling: Sister Cities* and *Pirates in Pinellas*. Some trunks which we have offered in the past are *Journey Stories*, the *War of 1812* and *Native Americans*. This program is free for all schools and education centers.

Tours:

Group tours are offered at the Dunedin Historical Museum, Andrews Memorial Chapel and the Dunedin Cemetery. Groups can tour one or multiple properties on the same day. DHM has four galleries to explore, three of which change depending on the season. The Andrews Memorial Chapel was built in 1888 and is now run as a non-denominational venue for

events. AMC offers students a chance to see original, Victorian-era architecture. The Dunedin Cemetery provides students a way to explore and discuss how the city of Dunedin has changed over time. Tour fees vary depending on the needs of the group. Please call for more information.

Lectures:

Museum staff can be scheduled to visit schools and are able to present lectures on various topics. We also participate in educational days such as the Pinellas History Day, the Great American Teach-In and National History Day. This is a free program.

Internships and Volunteering:

We welcome interns and volunteers of all ages. Some areas that our interns and volunteers work in are Archives, Collection Management, Exhibit Design, Event Coordinating, Living History, Special Events and Walking Tours. This is a great way for students to explore a possible career path, gain volunteer hours for scholarships and be involved in their community.

5000 ROLE MODELS OF EXCELLENCE PROJECT

Pinellas County Schools' 5000 Role Models of Excellence was created to boost the self-image, social skills and academic performance of selected males, in part, by motivating them to interact with respected and successful men from the community. This program matches young men who are struggling in school with mentors who will meet with them on a regular basis.
