Summer Camp Registration 2016

Summer Camp Registration period opens at 8 AM on Tuesday, March 8, 2016. You may register at the Dunedin Community Center or using our Online Registration (refer to section on pre-requisites). Both residents and non-residents may enroll in summer camps. (More detailed information on Page 2.)

Summer Camp registrations will continue until camps are full. You may enroll in Summer Camps* at the below location. Registration Office phone number is: 727-812-4530.

Pre-requisites

All parents will be required to complete a new Release/Waiver and a Child's Emergency/Identification Record for their child(ren).

- Our Release/Waiver has changed since last year and you must come to the Dunedin Community Center or Martin Luther King Jr. Recreation Center to complete and sign this form.
- We require new Child's Emergency/Identification Record forms each year; to be completed on or after 2/15/16
You can pick up this form at the Dunedin Community Center, the Martin Luther King Jr. Recreation Center or

If using a Dunedin Recreation I.D., it must be valid for the duration of any camp session(s) in which you are enrolling your child(ren). To purchase or renew an I.D. card, the child(ren) **must be present** since we now take photos.

- Oldsmar, Tarpon Springs and Safety Harbor residents: The Inter-Local Agreement for Recreation programs **excludes** child camps, therefore, you must either pay the "No Card" fee or purchase a Dunedin Recreation I.D. card to pay the lower camp fees.

Online Registration Pre-requisites (In addition to the above.)

Online Registration requires that you pay in full for any/all camp enrollments.

If you plan on paying the "No Card" camp fee, you must have an account set up for you to be able to enroll online. Contact the Registration Office for details: 727-812-4530.

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4 Steps to Enroll a Child in Summer Camp (I.D. Cards, Forms, Enroll & Pay)

1. Verify your child has a Dunedin Recreation I.D. card that is valid through the whole time period that you want to enroll the child in summer camp. A “No Card” camp fee is offered if you decide you do not want to purchase an I.D. card for your child.**
 - a. If you need to purchase or renew an I.D. card, you can do so at the Dunedin Community Center. **The child(ren) must be present to purchase or renew an I.D. card because photos are now taken.**
 - b. If you live in Dunedin city limits, be sure to bring with you a photo I.D. and either a utility bill, bank statement, credit card statement or some other “official” piece of mail that contains your name, your Dunedin address and a date within the last 90 days. A “resident” I.D. card is \$10 and is good for one year from date of issue.
 - c. If you do not live in Dunedin, you may purchase a Non-Resident I.D. card; have a photo I.D. with you. A 6-month Non-Resident I.D. card is \$56/person. A one-year Non-Resident I.D. card is \$90/person.
 - d. If you live in an “unincorporated” area of Pinellas County, you may purchase an Unincorporated I.D. card; have your driver’s license with you to use as photo I.D. and to show your address. An “unincorporated” I.D. card is \$56/person and is good for one year from date of issue.
2. The Registration Office (at the Dunedin Community Center) must have on file a new Release/Waiver form for each child, **completed on or after Feb. 15, 2016**. Also, a Child’s Emergency/Identification Record Form that was **completed on or after Feb. 15, 2016**.
 - a. The new Release/Waiver form must be completed by the child’s parent or legal guardian at either the Dunedin Community Center or the Martin Luther King Jr. Recreation Center.
 - b. You can pick up a Child’s Emergency/Identification Record Form at the Dunedin Community Center or the Martin Luther King Jr. Recreation Center. You can also download a blank form by going to www.dunedingov.com/camps.
3. Review the 2016 Summer Camp magazine and use it to complete the Parent Worksheet, identifying in which camp(s) you would like to enroll your child. Use one worksheet per child (you may make copies of the blank worksheet or ask for more at the Center).
4. You may complete your child’s enrollment by:
 - a. Coming to the Dunedin Community Center with all necessary paperwork, I.D. cards and payment
 - i. Pay using cash, check, VISA or MasterCard
 - ii. Paperwork: Parent worksheet(s), completed Child’s Emergency/Identification Record (and utility bill & photo ID if renewing or getting new resident or unincorporated I.D. card)
 - b. Using Online Registration to enroll your child** (See previous page for pre-requisites.)
 - i. Pay using VISA or MasterCard
 - ii. Must pay in full for any camp enrollments
 - c. Parents using Dunedin for Youth Fund scholarships (i.e. DFYF) MUST enroll children by coming to the Dunedin Community Center.

**NOTE

Online Registration for summer camps is available until 11:59 PM the Saturday before each camp week starts. Walk-in registration is available until a camp is full.

Also, if you choose to pay the “No Card” camp fees and want to use Online Registration, you must first come to the Registration Office at the Dunedin Community Center to set up your household account for Online Registration.
