Marina Safety

Staff takes pride in keeping our Marina • clean and safe for everyone to enjoy. Please be sure to check your slips for compliance of the following:

 Shore power cords must be specifically approved for marine use.
All household extension cords currently being used in the marina must be replaced immediately (see link below for helpful information).

Please bring vessels forward into the slip as far as possible, so vessels are protected • within the pilings. Before leaving your slip once docked, be sure to push and pull the • vessel in all directions to ensure that it cannot get under the dock/seawall, or go into the neighboring slip. Please remember to use spring lines!

Upcoming Projects

- **Fire Lines for Docks A, B and C:** New pipes will be installed in the coming weeks. All affected slip renters will be notified in advance of potential interruption in service.
- Marina Electrical Upgrades Project: The three electrical panels supplying power to the Marina, will be replaced in the upcoming months. Marina staff will provide slip renters advanced notification prior to necessary interruptions in service. Further details and scheduling information will be communicated as it becomes available.

Friendly Reminders

- Per the Marina Rules and Regulations, vessels must be **operable** and in **safe**, **seaworthy**, **well-maintained**, **and presentable condition** at all times.
- Please notify us if your contact information changes, including email addresses, as well as phone numbers.
 - Recent storms have brought heavy rain in short periods of time. Please check vessels often and make sure that bilge pumps and batteries continue to be in working order.
- check on your vessels periodically when you are out of town.
- Please disconnect hoses from the faucet when they are not in use. This helps to prevent corrosion, making it necessary for staff to cut the pipe when the hose needs to be replaced or removed.
- Please notify Marina staff should you have slip maintenance needs or observe any safety concerns.
- The Pinellas County Sheriff's Office encourages the public notify them when witnessing suspicious or concerning activity. An email to the Harbormaster is also appreciated.
