Liability Insurance - Important Reminder



The City of Dunedin requires that all slip renters obtain a valid certificate of general liability insurance. A copy of the certificate must be submitted and kept on file at the Marina Office. If you are renewing your insurance policy, please be sure to forward a copy of your new certificate to the Harbormaster's Office.

Recreation slip renters must obtain a valid certificate of general liability insurance in the amount of \$100,000/\$300,000.

Commercial slip renters must obtain a valid certificate of general liability insurance in the amount of \$1,000,000 naming the City of Dunedin as an additional insured.

Marina Projects Update



- Fishing Pier: the fishing pier will be advertised in June for bids to redeck.
- Clearwater Ferry: There are ongoing discussions regarding the Clearwater Ferry and having scheduled stops at the Dunedin Marina. Parks & Recreation staff will be recommending a pilot program to the City Commission for the dates of October 1, 2017 through February 28, 2018.
- **Dock "A" Rehabilitation:** Dock A is status Quo. It has been postponed for further scheduling concern. No further conversation has been had as to a commencement date or RFP.
- **Dredge Event:** Engineering has chosen a consultant (Amec, Foster, Wheeler) to complete an underwater survey and geotechnical data for the upcoming dredge event scheduled for 2019.

Hurricane Season: Prepare Now & Be Ready



National Hurricane Preparedness Week was May 7-13. It's important to get a head start now and prepare with these important tips:

- 1) Be sure your boat is insured and review your marine insurance policy.
- 2) Make a Storm Plan. Most insurance providers require a formal written plan detailing where and how your boat must be secured during a major storm.
- 3) Check with your marina about where your boat is moored to be sure the vessel can remain there during a hurricane. If it can

stay, know the procedure for securing your boat and those docked around it.

- 4) Make an inventory, preferably by video, of all valuable fixed items.
- 5) Store all the boat's important documents, including your marine insurance policy, in a secure place off the vessel.
- 6) Inspect your boat and make any necessary improvements or repairs, especially before the Florida heat waves are upon us.
