PSTA is not required to ensure that a passenger rides alone on a vehicle. All buses are wheelchair accessible.

### **Transportation Disadvantaged Program**

In order to qualify for Transportation Disadvantaged services In Pinellas County, a person must: live in Pinellas County; not be able to get a ride from household members or others for life-sustaining trips: medical, grocery, work, job-related training/education, and other vital services; have documented household income which does not exceed 150% of poverty level. Transportation is generally provided by reduced cost bus passes but taxi or wheelchair van door-to-door service may be approved for those unable to ride a bus. There is a fee for each one way trip for the door-to-door service.

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
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
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
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
