

Dunedin Marina Dredging Project

Weekly Updates - Week #10 (7/2/20)

Phase 3 of the dredging project is now well underway! While it seems that we are moving along at record speed, please remember that there is still much work ahead in the coming weeks/months. While Gator Dredging will not be providing us with a revised schedule, we do anticipate that the project will be completed considerably ahead of the contractual November 2nd deadline without unexpected delays.

Below is a chart showing the amount of sediment that has been removed from the phases each week since the dredging began.

- **IMPORTANT: Day Dock Access** – Gator Dredging will likely be moving toward the Day Dock area at some time next week. As they pass through the mouth of the marina, they will be relocating the turbidity barrier to encompass the pier. Once this happens, **there will be NO ACCESS** to any of the Day Dock slips until the barrier is removed from that area.
- **Liveboards** – Since we have now entered Phase 3, liveboards will not be able to return to their vessels until the entire project is completed. This is due to the fact that although your vessel is secured in a slip, the site remains a construction zone, preventing anyone from being permitted within the security fencing.
- **Dock Boxes** – Several of you have mentioned that you would be replacing your old dock boxes before your return to the marina. For your reference, Dunedin Marina Rules and Regulations regarding the dimensions and color of the dock boxes are below. Furthermore, the recent structural analysis of Dock A

emphasized the need for dock box sizes in **all slips throughout the marina** to be in compliance with the Marina Rules and Regulations.

“Dock boxes, if used, shall not exceed 27 inches in height, 26 inches in depth, or 48 inches in width. Such boxes shall be solid white and neatly maintained.”

- **Vessels Remaining in the Marina** – We will continue to schedule opportunities a couple of times each week throughout the end of the project in order to allow owners to check on the vessels that are remaining in the marina.
