

Dunedin Marina Dredging Project Weekly Updates - Week #11 (7/10/20)

Phase 3 of the dredging project continues as the commercial wall and day docks are being dredged. The Pier and Day Docks remain closed while being dredged both mechanically and hydraulically. Meanwhile, marina staff continue to install finger dock boards in preparation for vessels returning to the slips once we are ready to reopen.

Below is the updated chart showing the amount of sediment that has been removed from the phases each week since the dredging began.

- **Pier and Day Dock Access** – There is currently no access to the Day Dock slips or the pier until the barrier is removed from the area.
- **Insurance Reminder** – Just a friendly reminder that if you haven't done so already, please send the Declarations Page of your policy to us if you have not done so already. We will be sending an email soon to those of you that need updated information in your file.
- **Dock A Improvements** – Dock A repairs will be underway once the dredging company's equipment has moved away from the area. Materials for this have been ordered and are onsite.
- **Dock Boxes** - Thank you to all of you for your quick response to our request for removal of the dock boxes from Dock A. For quick reference, Dunedin Marina Rules and Regulations regarding the dimensions and color of the dock boxes are below. In order to prevent doing further harm to the existing stringers and improve accessibility to slips throughout the marina, we will require compliance with the dock box size indicated below upon your return.

“Dock boxes, if used, shall not exceed **27 inches in height, 26 inches in depth, or 48 inches in width.** Such boxes shall be solid white and neatly maintained.”

- **Vessels Remaining in the Marina** – We will continue to schedule opportunities a couple of times each week throughout the end of the project in order to allow owners to check on the vessels that are remaining in the marina.
